Vintage Report

Burgundy 2024: A vintage defined by adversity and ultimately triumph

The 2024 Burgundy vintage will go down as one of the most challenging in living memory – yet also one of the most rewarding.

Against a backdrop of relentless rain, rampant mildew, and devastating frost and hail, growers fought tirelessly to salvage their crops. Yields are dramatically down, but the fruit that survived benefitted from a long, slow ripening season, delivering **wines of remarkable purity and balance.**

The whites are truly exceptional – precise and on point, echoing the great vintages of 2014 and 2017. Believe the hype – these are special wines that could only have been made in Burgundy.

The reds, though scarce, offer vibrant, energetic expressions of true Burgundian Pinot Noir that beguile with their tenderness and soul. For me, they are just the type of Pinot Noir I like to drink, and the only advice here is – *be quick.*

The vintage distinguishes itself through clarity and finesse rather than opulence. Both reds and whites show a gentle, authentic character that reflects the year's challenges and triumphs. Furthermore, it's a vintage that underlines the notion of terroir, within the tapestry of climats across the region.

Volumes are painfully small, yet the wines reward with restraint, freshness and a true sense of terroir. It's always hard to generalise, but 2024 is a vintage for those who value definition and elegance, offering wines to savour now and treasure in the years ahead.

Growing season & impact on yields

Persistent rainfall from flowering through summer caused severe mildew pressure, washing away treatments almost as soon as

they were applied. Organic and biodynamic vineyards faced particular challenges, with some growers abandoning certification to save their grapes. Chablis endured additional frost and hail, even wiping out entire parcels.

By August, warm, dry weather finally arrived, allowing sugars to rise and phenolic ripeness to develop. Harvest was late and highly selective, stretching into late September.

Overall, yields are down significantly, with some domaines losing up to 80%. Chablis was hardest hit, while the Côte de Nuits saw severe losses in Pinot Noir. Conventional growers generally fared better than organic ones, though small, hands-on domaines managed to mitigate losses through relentless effort.

The whites are outstanding: focused, ripe and beautifully balanced

They combine vibrant acidity with moderate alcohol and sweet fruit, reminiscent of benchmark vintages like 2014 and 2017. Many growers even believe their 2024 whites surpass these celebrated years.

Meursault, Chassagne and Puligny all deliver a killer combination of energy, ravishing acidity and mineral-forged focus.

In Chablis, we return to a style that will please the purists – crystalline purity with majestic orchard fruits and hallmark crustacean depth.

Finally, overlook the Mâconnais at your peril. For me, the wines of Domaine Saumaize-Michelin offer some of the very best quality to price ratio in this whole offer.

All in all, these are some of the most exciting whites we've come across in recent years, and I'd advise seeking them out for your cellar.

The reds are limited in quantity but delicious: pure, bright and elegant

Winemakers favoured gentle extraction, cool fermentations and restrained oak, resulting in luminous, energetic Pinot Noirs. These wines promise immense mid-term drinking pleasure and a return to a classic Burgundian style.

Gevrey-Chambertin is a case in point. These sometimes formidably structured wines wear a more alluring and tender jacket this year.

Whereas, perhaps unsurprisingly, Chambolle-Musigny offers up heartbreakingly beautiful, red berry-scented renditions in 2024.

From our tastings, I must single out the Côte de Beaune reds, especially those of Volnay. In present day terms, these offer so much value, and if you move up to 1er Cru level, you are getting an awful lot wine for your money.

Overall, the reds have the potential to surpass vintages like 2014 & 2021. Which incidentally are both showing very well now, and show what a fine vintage 2024 will become.

Buying guidance by classification & estimated drinking dates

- **Village & Bourgogne Blanc** (Chablis, Côte de Beaune, Mâconnais): Drink 2026–2032*
Expect crystalline fruit, tension and moderate alcohols – superb value.
- **Premier Cru / Grand Cru Whites**: Drink 2027–2038*
Depth and precision – comparisons to 2014 and 2017 feel warranted.
- **Village Reds** (Côte de Nuits & Beaune): Drink 2027–2033*
Pure, bright Pinot Noirs with gentle tannins and vivid acidity.

- **Premier Cru Reds**: Drink 2028–2036+*
Graceful structure, minimal oak signatures and lifted aromatics.
- **Grand Cru Reds**: Drink 2032–2040*
Angular, sculpted and even greater focus than their 1er Cru siblings.

In summary

Quantities are extremely small and many wines will only be available En Primeur. Pricing remains largely stable versus 2023 and given two consecutive small harvests, demand is already strong. Early orders are essential.

Ultimately, 2024 is a testament to the resilience and craftsmanship of the region's artisan winemakers. Despite nature's relentless challenges, Burgundy growers have produced wines of extraordinary character – wines that speak of place, perseverance and purity.

For collectors and enthusiasts alike, we wholly recommend these. These are wines born from a vintage of adversity, that in some cases will be destined for greatness.

The whites offer exceptional value at all levels, and potentially lay claim to generational greatness, while the reds are rare gems for true Burgundy lovers.

Remember, once they're gone, they're gone.

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Domaine Servin

Winemaking at this traditional Chablis property is shared by Australian-born and vinous global explorer Mark Cameron (who exhibits an unparalleled energy and passion for the region), alongside his brother-in-law François Servin.

As for the wines, they're utterly true to the appellation's mineral classicism and frankly, offer some of the very best value in this offer.

In 2024, Marc and the team have managed to coax out beautiful generosity in the wines, which allied to the natural energy and racy acidity of the vintage, is a match made in Chablis heaven. So the good news is the wines are outstanding. The bad news? Volumes are down by around two thirds, so there is relatively little to go around. Be sure to secure your share early.

Samuel Billaud

Samuel Billaud is a benchmark in Chablis and a true tour de force. There's a concentration, verve and marine magic to his wines that few can match. No wonder that in the past decade that we've listed Samuel's wines, we've seen them soar from being relatively unknown to competing with the dual titans of the region – Raveneau & Dauvissat.



For me, nobody in Chablis has managed to forge the old with the new style as seamlessly as Samuel. His wines are all about finesse: being both tensile and endowed with significant limestone fused Jurassic minerality, yet also expertly fleshed out, with singing fruit. These are wines that simply make you want to take another sip.

2024 itself is a small crop following hail on 1st May (which severely affected the yield in many of the Premiers Crus, in particular Montmains, Vaillons, Séchet and Fourchaume) and an inconsistent flowering. That said, Samuel's volume is greater than the frost-affected 2021 crop, as meticulous work in the vineyard throughout the summer helped avoid greater losses.

I have no doubt that the wines made at this address are among the very best in the region, and will please old and new fans alike. And remarkably, prices are still sane. In fact, across the board not a single wine has seen a price increase on last year.

Bearing in mind reduced volumes, I'd urge you to buy as much as you can, as these are some of the finest wines we have access to and will offer so much over the next decade or more. As you can probably tell by now, these wines come highly recommended!

Domaine William Fèvre

After a full day's tasting, we finished at arguably the benchmark producer of the region, and the largest holder of Grands Crus in Chablis.

The wines were impressive as always, however 2024 will be remembered as one of the lowest-yielding vintages ever for team Fèvre. Temperature variations during flowering led to coulure, compounded by several episodes of hail and severe mildew pressure. These weather and health factors had a significant impact on volume, resulting in an historically low harvest with an average of 9 hl/ha. That's around 90% less volume than in 2023.

Regrettably, our allocation is in keeping with the losses at the domaine and thus we will be restricting purchases to those that bought in 2023 initially. Please enquire.



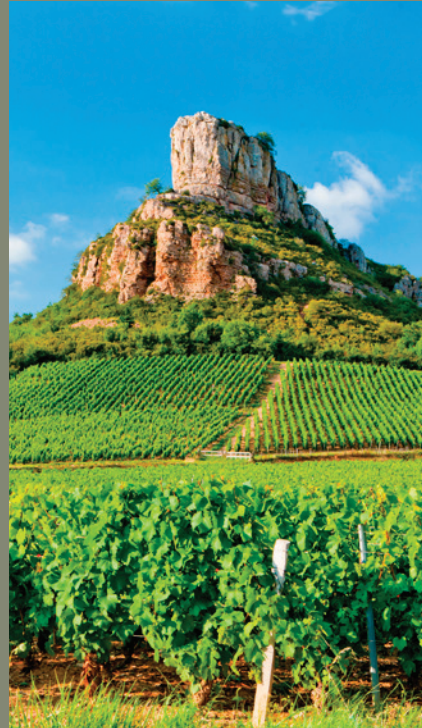

La Soufrandière

La Soufrandière (aka the Bret Brothers), has quickly become one of the cult names of the Mâconnais.

It was Grandfather Bret who bought the handsome house that gives this domaine its name in 1947. And crucially, he also purchased four hectares of vines entirely in the appellation of Pouilly-Vinzelles. But it wasn't until 2000, when Jean-Philippe and Jean-Guillaume (the Bret Brothers) withdrew from the local co-operative, that La Soufrandière was established. They haven't looked back since.

Today it's recognised as a source of some of the finest wines the Mâconnais has to offer. These are wines of beautiful precision and, like Saumaize-Michelin, offer exceptional quality versus price.

Domaine Saumaize-Michelin

This is our second vintage listing the lauded Mâconnais and biodynamic producer, Domaine Saumaize-Michelin. And we're far from the only ones to have beaten a path here of late. Neal Martin, Allen Meadows and William Kelley have all been singing the praises of this truly boutique property.

Christine and Roger Saumaize have recently handed the day-to-day running of the estate to their children Vivien and Lisa. Vivien has been making the wines since 2018 and continues the meticulous approach of his father, whilst introducing some small but significant new ideas and techniques, such as the fermentation of a small part of the crop in 56-litre glass globes.

After a cold and miserable wet spring, the 2024 harvest took place in the second week of September in perfect conditions and helped contribute a healthy 42 hl/ha. Vivien continued his practice of picking in the early morning and chilling the fruit in a cold chamber before pressing later in the day.

The 2024s are all about harmony – fresh, perfectly pitched wines, set with beautiful fruit, ravishing acidity and long mineral-fused finishes. These are wines that genuinely give those of the Côte d'Or a run for their money, and even at the top-end of the spectrum offer brilliant value for money. For us these are no-brainer purchases.

Domaine Bachelet-Monnot

Bachelet-Monnot is already firmly established as one of the elite producers of white Burgundy. Once the preserve of just those 'in the know' (not anymore), the cat is well and truly out of the bag!

Now the reds are fast catching up and, as I have noted over the past few years, actually offer some of the best value in all Burgundy.

Naturally, the whites represent some of the most thrilling wines we ever get our hands on, and whether new to this domaine or a seasoned buyer, don't hesitate to get involved this year. Even the junior wines show excellent precision, with impressive length and focus as you move up the range. The 2024 whites are vibrant, energetic wines, that show excellent terroir transparency between their sites. Whereas the reds are tender and soulful renditions of Pinot, that simply will demand to be uncorked even at a relatively early juncture.

The only caveat is volumes are dramatically down, so please be quick to secure.

Domaine Alain Chavy

The Chavy family is one of the oldest names in Puligny, and the domaine was split between two brothers in 2003. Alain's share is a mere 7 hectares but it includes some of the finest Premier Cru sites in the appellation, including an achingly rare parcel of Les Clavoillons (a virtual monopole with the rest owned by Leflaive). These days it's run by Alain, Corinne and son Corentin.



Ever since establishing the domaine, Alain and Corentin have overseen a steady rise in the quality of the wines. Made in a signature restrained style, Alain always ensures optimum ripeness of fruit with a crisp acidity lending the wines exceptional cellaring potential.

All grapes are hand-harvested, pressed and fermented in barrel at not more than 25°C. The entire crop is barrel fermented which gives additional depth and intensity to the wines, with a portion aged in larger 400 litre barrels that impart a much more delicate oak influence, allowing the complexity of the fruit to shine. The deep cellar keeps the barrels wonderfully cool and allows for a slow, late malolactic fermentation, accompanied by measured bâtonnage.

The result is that these are some of the best wines to be made in Puligny. The 2024s are no exception – crisp, mineral wines that have wonderful purity of fruit, these will age magnificently.

Domaine Alex Moreau

Formerly Domaine Bernard Moreau, Alex has been bottling the wines under his own name since the estate was split with his brother in 2021. As ever, these are absolute top-drawer wines that genuinely rank among some of the finest white Burgundy you'll come across.

This was a highly accomplished lineup with a wonderful ying and yang of richness and racy energy throughout. Even at the Bourgogne Blanc level, there is serious precision and refinement.

2024 was a 'traditional' late harvest on the 26th September. The overall crop was not as catastrophic for Moreau as it was for others, with 35-38hl/ha achieved on average, which is normal in the Premiers Crus.

There is only one problem with this domaine: we cannot get enough! Please enquire.

Domaine Antoine Jobard

5th generation Antoine Jobard took over from his father François on his retirement twelve years ago, and we've been working with him ever since. This is always one of our favourite visits in Meursault, and Antoine was on fine form as ever.

As for the wines, the 2024s are textbook Jobard, showing significant tension, allied to classic steely tautness, which offsets the natural flamboyance of Meursault impeccably.

Antoine considers the wines to be of the fresh and fine profile, without over ripeness. He sees them as a step up from 2021, with more concentration and succulent, ripe fruit.

This is another benchmark selection of whites from one of the leading lights of Meursault.

Domaine Jean Chartron

It's always an absolute pleasure to visit our very old friend Jean-Michel Chartron. We've worked with the Chartrons for over 60 years, which gives us access to one of the most enviable global allocations. This relationship has paid dividends recently, as the reputation of this address and demand for its wines have soared. As Neal Martin writes, they're "up there with the greats like Comtes-Lafon, Leflaive and so on."

What sets the domaine apart is the standard of excellence throughout the range. The quality of an elite producer should be apparent even in the junior wines and you can have the utmost confidence here in both the Bourgogne Blanc and Rully.



The village Puligny-Montrachet is one of the finest in the region (I buy it without fail every vintage), as is its Chassagne sibling. Ultimately, these are wines that offer a huge amount of drinking pleasure. Whether you're looking for something for early drinking or to cellar, this domaine should be firmly on your radar.

Chartron fared well in comparison to many of his peers in 2024 and still managed to produce reasonable quantities. Stylistically, he opined that the 2024s could be compared to 2014 – the greatest whites vintage this century!

The wines are fresh, classic and simply some of the very finest white Burgundy made today. And despite all the recent attention, Chartron's prices have remained significantly lower than their illustrious neighbours. What's not to love?

Furthermore, his 2024s were tasting brilliantly with a wonderful combination of energy, freshness and poise. There is no doubt that this is a property on an upward curve and definitely one to watch.

Domaine Philippe Colin

We were fortunate to be able to taste with Philippe this year, who was at home in his bijou Chassagne tasting room. As you may know, he splits his time these days between Burgundy and his exciting wine projects in South Africa.

As ever, this was a most comprehensive tasting of predominantly Chassagne and Saint-Aubin climats. The 2024s were showing great terroir delineation, and at their peaks were breathtaking, including a Chassagne-Montrachet 1er Cru En Remilly reminiscent of Chevalier-Montrachet.

These wines are seriously good and, in such a strong white Burgundy vintage, are very much worth seeking out.

Domaine Joseph Colin

Joseph left his heralded family estate, Domaine Marc Colin, in 2016 and 2024 was the 8th vintage produced under his own name. In this time, his wines have become some of the most sought after in our en primeur offer.

The domaine specialises in Chassagne-Montrachet and Saint-Aubin, featuring 21 appellations, including a wealth of Premiers Crus. This year, we were blown away again by the quality of the wines.

These are among the most pure, fine and terroir-transparent whites in the Côte de Beaune, and all are highly recommended. But please be quick, as there is never enough to meet demand.

Domaine Matrot

We had a super visit to Matrot, tasting a wide spectrum of beautifully sculpted, focused whites, as well as ethereal, almost dancing Pinot Noirs.

The sisters, like their father before them, believe in using oak only very sparingly. They are firm believers that quality comes from the vineyard, so let the fruit do the talking. They were very happy with the quality in 2024: the reds are cool, supple and fresh and the whites are precise with great ageing potential.

If you are quick this year, we have also secured a small number of magnums. If you haven't tried these wines, you simply must!

Domaine Jean-Jacques Girard

Founded in 1529 by Jean Girard, this is the oldest domaine in Savigny. Defying the pressures of the modern age, it still remains within the hands of the Girard family. Jean-Jacques and Agnes's son, Vincent, have been making the wine for several years and are now joined by Vincent's younger brother, François. The domaine extends over 20 hectares covering the best-known appellations of the northern Côte de Beaune.

Under the current stewardship of Vincent, the estate is enjoying new levels of excellence and has produced a string of brilliant vintages, including 2024.

The 2024 harvest lasted from 15th to 26th September at chez Girard, with highly satisfactory yields (40 hl/ha for the reds) following meticulous work in the vineyards during the wet spring and summer. These are some of the most delightful reds in this offer and represent exceptional value for money.

Domaine Dubreuil-Fontaine

Few visits elicit as much pleasure as one to Christine Gruère-Dubreuil's picture-postcard Pernand-Vergelesses property. The village itself sits next to the famous hill of Corton and the Grand Cru vineyard of Corton-Charlemagne. Immediately to the north, you find the vineyards of Pernand-Vergelesses, which produce intense, mineral-rich wines that age beautifully and whose whites mimic the structure and energy of their neighbour.

We've been following this address for well over a decade and in that time, they've cemented themselves as one of our most popular Burgundy offerings, with high praise from the critics. In 2024, we have one of the finest selections yet.

Domaine Joseph Voillot

Arguably one of the finest estates in Volnay, these vineyards have been farmed for 6 generations and cover a tiny 8 hectares in total. Étienne Chaix took over the reins from his uncle and Burgundian royalty Jean-Pierre Charlot in 2017. He's continued Jean-Pierre's fine work and manages to encapsulate the tenderness and beauty of Pinot Noir like few others.



Like many other addresses, volumes are low in 2024, with the domaine reporting yields of 20hl/ha. However, the quality is superb and I'd suggest that everybody should look to find space in their cellars. Of particular note is a very fine Premier Cru Champans which is so pretty and delicate, juxtaposed with significant depth and fine minerality.

Domaine François Buffet

This gem of a domaine is run by the genial Marc-Olivier Buffet, whose family have been making wine in Volnay since 1692. Today it covers 7.5 hectares, including a wealth of old vines in the most prestigious vineyards of Volnay and Pommard.

The bad news is that the cellar was looking bare as 2024 has been especially harsh here. Volumes are heartbreakingly small. In normal years, Marc-Olivier can make 25-30 barrels of Bourgogne Pinot Noir alone; this year his total production is just 22 barrels.

The good news is that the wines have never been better. 2024 vintage was Marc-Olivier's first year of organic certification. His regenerative farming and biodynamic work mean the vines are healthier than ever before and point to a very bright future indeed at this address.

Stylistically, I'd say the wines are somewhere between 2023 and 2021; richer than 2021 but still very classic and not as powerful as 2022.

Domaine Comte Armand

2024 marked our first visit to this most illustrious of Côte de Beaune properties. The domaine's most famous asset is their world famous Clos des Epeneaux, a magnificent 5-hectare Premier Cru. In addition to their flagship vineyard, the domaine produces wines from vineyard plots in the nearby villages of Volnay and Auxey-Duresses.

We tasted with Paul Zinetti, who has been their highly regarded winemaker and estate manager (régisseur) since 2014. Sadly, in 2024, they saw losses of 80%, so there will be very little wine available here. However, what has been produced is of the highest quality. Limited quantities and high demand for these sought after wines mean early enquiries are essential.

Laroze de Drouhin & Domaine Drouhin-Laroze

This is an address with an embarrassment of riches at its disposal, with half their vineyards boasting Grand Cru status and four Grands Crus in our offer alone. As always, it's also worth highlighting the excellent value négoce offerings under the Laroze de Drouhin label.

The 2024s showed incredible early promise, displaying their undeniable breeding at all levels. 2024 is the first vintage produced from their new custom-built winery. But unfortunately, volumes are dramatically reduced here – average yields of just 25-28hl/ha on – so please be quick in registering your interest.

Maison Joseph Drouhin

Joseph Drouhin is one of Burgundy's most prestigious and historic wine producers and, alongside Bouchard and Faiveley, one of the three elite negociant and domaine holding houses. Founded in 1880, it remains family-owned and is currently managed by the fourth generation of the family: Philippe, Véronique, Laurent and Frédéric.

Unfortunately, like their peer Faiveley, this house saw heartbreaking volume reductions in 2024. This has resulted in a much-diminished offer this year, especially for the red wines. However, there is slightly more availability on the whites, up to and including their benchmark Le Montrachet. Please enquire for an allocation.

Domaine Heresztyn-Mazzini

Domaine Heresztyn has existed since the 1930s but was reborn Domaine Heresztyn-Mazzini in 2012, when Florence Heresztyn took over with her husband, Simon Mazzini (a highly regarded Champagne winemaker). They have quickly built a reputation as one of the finest names in Gevrey, with favourable comparisons being made to the Gevrey grand master – Rousseau.

In 2024, the wet summer enforced 18 treatments of the vines against mildew with the size of the crop also reduced by poor weather at flowering. Most of the bunches were destemmed and the vinification was adapted, with shorter macerations to ensure only the ripest tannins were extracted from the skins. Very little new oak was used to avoid overpowering the brightness of the fruit and the result is a beautiful range of wines with polished textures and excellent terroir delineation.

Domaine Hudelot-Baillet

Dominique Le Guen's son, Tanguy, is increasingly involved in the winemaking, as the baton slowly passes from one generation to the next. The 2024s showed great finesse, and the controlled precision that we have become accustomed to. However, what really sets them apart is a powerful intensity and concentration drawn from some very old vines.

Unfortunately, there was no Premier Cru Borniques produced in 2024 – the vineyard simply didn't produce enough to make even a barrel. So, turning a negative into a positive, Dominique added these grapes to his Chambolle Musigny Vieilles Vignes – making this a very attractive proposition this year. 2024 again confirms this domaine's place at Chambolle's top table and we expect these to be among the most sought after wines in this offer.

Domaine Felettig

We've seen increasing demand for the wines of this domaine, which is hardly surprising given they own some truly excellent parcels in Chambolle-Musigny, Vosne-Romanée and Nuits-Saint-Georges.

The reds at this address typically see a touch more new oak across the range than others we select, but crucially there is great balance and integration.

The Bourgogne Rouge is our top value pick here, coming from a plot of 45-year-old vines just across the road from Chambolle-Musigny.

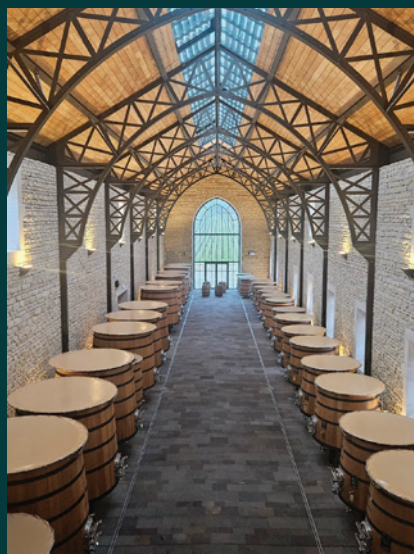

Domaine Henri Gouges

Gouges is one of Nuits-Saint-Georges' most famous domaines and has been owned by the Gouges family since 1919. Today the domaine covers 14 hectares, exclusively in Nuits-Saint-Georges. With seven Premiers Crus, including the notable monopole of Clos des Porrets Saint-Georges, it's easy to see why Gouges is such a key name in this famous appellation.

Gouges was always known for its structured reds built for the long-haul. And whilst the wines are still just as age-worthy, under the guidance of Grégory and Antoine Gouges, they've become more silky and refined in style.

Arguably the standouts in 2024 are Les Saint Georges, the unofficial 'Grand Cru' of Nuits-Saint-Georges, as well as Clos des Porrets, a Gouges monopole that sits just under Perrières and is almost as stony.

Domaine Alain Burguet

Wow, what a character, and how refreshing to meet a vigneron that's so comfortable in their own skin and in following their own instincts. Jean-Luc Burguet is not just a breath of fresh air, but an exceptional artisan and dare I say, vine whisperer!

The domaine itself was founded in 1976 by his father Alain Burguet, and is now exclusively manned by our new friend Jean-Luc. The estate covers about 10 hectares of vineyards, with a strong focus on sustainable viticulture and minimal intervention winemaking, including biodynamic practices. However, Jean-Luc allows himself leeway to meet the demands of the growing season, so pragmatism can and will be applied to suit the demands of the day. The wines have a distinct richness and complexity, but are offset with feathery freshness and elegance.

Jean-Luc famously waits to harvest until after most of his neighbours in the village (often, in his words, 'to gentle ribbing'). Allied to his gentle vinification process, Burgundy's cool autumn nights and the organic health of the vines, Jean-Luc believes this ensures on-point acidity and produces wines of great finesse with fine tannins. Having spent a wonderful early morning appointment with him, we can't help but agree.
