## **Bordeaux 2019: Vintage Summary**

Certainly this was the most unusual Bordeaux En Primeur offer we have ever put together. At the time we were due to be hopping from château to château in Bordeaux, we had just been locked down in the UK. Rather than five days of intense tasting, feeding and trying desperately hard not to be late for the next appointment, we were setting up offices at home, trying to book supermarket delivery slots and assessing quite how much we could get done in our gardens. I am delighted to say my garden is now looking as good as it ever has, I have a reasonably full larder and we have a rather exciting and appealing Bordeaux vintage on our hands.

It may be considered a positive in regards to this review that we did not spend a lot of time over there, so we did not talk endlessly about yields, harvest times and the use of whole bunch fermenation which seem to be the in vogue points of discussion among those that taste. Samples were sent around the globe at impressive speed to critics and us merchants, so we have been able to focus on what is in the bottle rather than anything else. No bad thing perhaps for the consumer? My recycling boxes have been regularly overflowing, socially distanced tastings with my colleagues on my driveway were enacted, it transpires leftover samples make a very good base for meatballs and I think we now have a pretty good understanding of what Bordeaux 2019 has to offer.

But, before we talk about the specific wines in question, it would be folly not to talk about pricing, albeit briefly. Every year that I can recall there has been pressure put on the Bordelais to ensure that there is a strong reason to buy en primeur. Prices in Bordeaux have risen and fallen...though mainly risen over the last 20 years. Vintages like 2000, 2005, 2009, 2010 and 2016 have pushed the limits of what customers are willing to pay. A pattern emerges though. Invariably, soon after these higher priced vintages, more reasonably priced vintages release. 2001, 2008, 2014 and perhaps now 2019 have been more modestly priced in light of some rather unusual market conditions to give consumers a real incentive to buy and when married with the quality on offer in 2019, we have seen brisk trade thus far. While pricing is not down evenly across the board, the likes of Château Pontet-Canet set the tone early with a 30% price reduction on last year's price despite being awarded top markers from RobertParker.com. We bought almost five times as much as we did last year and it still sold in a flash. This is what the market demanded and in many cases it is what the market got.

The Fine Wine Team, Jean-Marc and I have tasted hundreds of samples, in many cases multiple samples, of the same wine, so I feel confident we have a good handle on the vintage. It is quite a stark contrast to 2018; far more supple, with easier to appreciate tannins than the 2018s and across the board the alcohol levels appear to be less intrusive and the wines appear considerably fresher. The fruit very much comes to the fore which has made them considerably more appealing to taste at this stage. They remind me a little of the 2009s, but with greater definition and elegance, a little like the 2015s, but certainly more consistent in the Médoc. Overall, I would still put the 2016s a nose ahead of the 2019s, but they are in the same conversation. Whereas the 2016s and 2018s are built for the long haul, I think I would have far less hesitation in tucking into 2019s earlier, though I have little doubt they will cellar well.

I am often asked where and what would I buy? In general, I think Margaux and St-Julien have performed particularly well, though as always seems to be the case nowadays St-Estèphe has so many well priced gems compared to the likes of Pauillac and St-Julien. St-Emilion for be has proven to be more exciting than Pomerol, certainly given the prices each demand. At this stage, I must admit, as yet I have not tasted enough dry whites or sweet wines to form an accurate opinion.

The color is opaque purple-black, with a nose that unfurls slowly in the glass, beginning with vibrant, expressive black fruit notes of freshly crushed blackcurrants, ripe blackberries and fresh black cherries, followed by a beguiling array of floral and earth nuances—candied violets, lavender, fragrant soil, underbrush, crushed rocks and black truffles.
