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LAITHWAITES FINE WINE Vintage Report

To say Bordeaux 2021 is a complicated vintage would not be doing justice to the vignerons and winemakers who had so many challenges, yet in many cases still made many excellent wines.

The challenges can be broadly summarised into three:

• Vulnerable vines were subjected to two bouts of **frost**, in April and Early May. Though this was localised, so while it impacted some Châteaux, it didn't impact all. Where it was problematic, this caused issues with yields rather than quality.

• Spells of rain in the height of summer brought **mildew**. Depending on location of the vineyard this either had a significant impact or not much. The windier vineyards on the top of hills or in more exposed areas of the Northern Médoc for example were barely impacted, those in more inlands, sheltered or low-lying areas were more troubled. If a Château were able to afford to be strict with their selection at harvest, the impact from mildew was moderate, for those who could not, the impact on quality was significant.

Finally, just before harvest in early October, a lot of rain was forecast. While the grapes were phenological ripe (the ripeness of the seeds, skins, and stems) at this stage, the physical ripeness (the sugars in the flesh) were still low. Some Châteaux therefore harvested earlier than they ideally would, the result in many cases being slightly underripe, slightly herbal wines. Many gambled though and waited to harvest, thankfully the forecast rain never materialised and those who waited were rewarded with ripe grapes capable of producing excellent wine.

Bordeaux 2021 is a patchwork vintage. If Château were fortunate and fell on the right side of each of the three challenges, they made some outstanding wine. Those who fell on the wrong side of all three have produced wine which I would not recommend. Then of course there are some who were impacted by just one or two.

In summary, it's a vintage which was capable of producing wines I would heartily recommend, but many which I would advise against. Our role as a merchant this year is vital. We will be offering a far smaller range than normal, focusing on those who have performed well and looking out for 'our picks' as well as reading the critics' notes will be essential.
