In 2019 they had plenty of it. It was dry too. Very dry, in fact, but just when panic was about to set it, the heavens opened just enough to refresh the vines and see them through to harvest. There were no disease pressures, with the only cloud on the horizon the one whose hail wiped out a proportion of Crozes-Hermitage on the 15th June.

So, we have another top Rhône vintage on our hands, extending the recent run of excellent form. The big questions are "where does the vintage sit alongside the likes of 2015 and 2016?" and "is it a vintage where the North or the South did better?" Ultimately, time will have to be the decider of that. So many of the 2019s show great ageing potential, with substantial ripe tannins wrapping up dense primary fruit, completed by surprisingly fresh acidity given the summer's heat.

While the pandemic put paid to our usual trip to the region, the majority of estates were kind enough to send samples over to us and from these comprehensive tastings, I might be inclined to mark this one down as a vintage where the North has edged it, just. Domaine du Tunnel's Stéphane Robert calls his harvest "extremely high-quality, with both ripeness and high acidity" (Vinous.com), while in a very enlightening Zoom call, Michel Chapoutier pointed out to us that the vintage conditions gave rise to "extraordinarily complex wines" that "bear no signs of the excessive heat of the vintage".

I dare say some of those in the South would take issue with my conclusion. Domaine Saint-Préfert's Isabel Ferrando was delighted with her crop, picking out the grapes' "structure, colour and health", summing up: "In 2019, the perfect sanitary condition of the grapes has allowed the production of highly coloured, smooth and generous red Châteauneuf-du-Pape wines. The whites are rich, full, with a long finish."

The white wines especially benefitted from the vintage's magic combination of ripeness and freshness. The best combine explosive, hedonistic fruit with a backbone of acidity to keep them fresh and focused.

While volumes produced are down in the North, they are up on 2018 in the South and prices are broadly in line with last year, helping to keep the Rhône France's best value Fine Wine region by far. Our primeur offer encompasses a selection of growers that we think really hit the mark, from the astounding value Southern Rhône reds of Domaine Martin to the 'Sélections Parcellaires' that mark the very pinnacle of Michel Chapoutier's, and the region's production.

P.S. You may spot an interloper in the offer. Michel Chapoutier's Roussillon outpost Domaine de Bila-Haut more than deserves to be featured alongside this stable's Rhône wines, while stylistically the wines show many similarities. They are therefore included, in their own section.

Domaine Martin

A big customer favourite and it's no surprise why; the reds produced here are out and out delicious and are offered at exceptionally good prices. This makes them ideal house wines to keep in stock throughout the year.

The 2019 line up from Domaine Martin once again delivered the goods. Typical of the vintage, these are big boned wines jam packed full of ripe fruit. Tannins were big, but also ripe. As is often the case with these wines, by the time they arrive in the UK they will have softened sufficiently to be irresistible without the need for further cellaring, but with a few years' potential should you be so minded.

"God's plain" is Domaine Martin's home turf and one only has to set foot outside the winery itself to immediately be in these vineyards, blessed not only with a good view of the Mont Ventoux looming ominously in the background, but also with a pebbly soil very similar to that of many parts of Châteauneuf-du-Pape. The wine itself is friendly, rounded and fruit driven. It is phenomenal value and an excellent signature of the Domaine.

Domaine Martin 2019 Rasteau

A broad palate, jam packed full of bright black and red fruit. This has a serious side, with 30% Syrah and 5% Mourvèdre in the blend, but delivers an awful lot of immediate pleasure. Can age for five years, but don't feel guilty if you pull the cork straight away, as it will deliver right from the off.

Domaine Martin 2019 Cairanne

Given 3 to 4 months in barrique after fermentation in concrete, this 65% Grenache, 35% Syrah blend is unmistakably Southern Rhône. Super-ripe fruit is joined by a touch of pepper, spices and hints of Provençal herbs on a palate that makes a real impression.

Domaine Martin 'Les Sommets de Rasteau' 2019 Rasteau

This is Rasteau with all the dials turned up to eleven! Masses of sweet dark fruit are joined by hulking tannins that promise good ageing potential. At this stage, this is almost challenging to taste, but there is no doubt of the wine's excellent quality, especially so when the price is factored in. For all the weight of fruit, the wine is perfectly balanced, promising an ability to age harmoniously for 5+ years.

"One of my favorite southern Rhone estates, Montirius, which is run by the passionate Christine and Eric Saurel, fashions classic Gigondas and Vacqueyras from their roughly 143 acres under vine" Jeb Dunnuck

There is a lot to like about Montirius and the wines that are produced there. Run by the charming couple Christine and Eric Saurel and their daughters Justine and Manon, they adopted full biodynamics in 1996 and none of the wines see any oak ageing. No sulphur is added at bottling either, so these are wines where the fruit sings solo, unadulterated by other influences.

The whole range is impressive, showcasing the meticulous attention to detail that is found at many biodynamic estates, but at the top of the tree is the Vacqueyras 'Le Clos' whose clay soils have been analysed and found to be identical to those at Château Petrus (something Petrus's neighbours would kill for) and the Gigondas 'Terre des Aînés'. For something very different, the Bourboulenc-dominant white Vacqueyras 'Minéral' ages beautifully, gaining complexity while maintaining freshness. It's more Rheingau than Rhône!

'Le Village' was another wine from Montirius's line up that was showing very well in our tasting. I could have sworn there was some old oak on used on this wine from how well rounded it is, but there is not. As with all of the estate's wines, the fruit is allowed to express itself unencumbered by wood. Robust tannins and modest alcohol belie the heat of the vintage.

Montirius 'Jardin Secret' 2019 Côtes-du-Rhône

Not a wine we usually list, but the quality was so good in 2019 we simply could not say no. The texture is just superb, with supple tannins supporting a wine of surprising intensity, with a touch of spice to go with the ripe, succulent fruit. From a plot of 55 year old Grenache vines planted in Sablet, the lack of another grape variety in the blend prevents the wine obtaining the mention 'Côtes-du-Rhône Villages Sablet' on the label, but is absolutely the right decision for this wine.

Montirius 'La Terre des Aînés' 2019 Gigondas

In many a winemaker's hands the 2019 Terre des Aînés 2019 would have ended up an overblown blockbuster. Not here though. Super-ripe black cherry on the attack promises hedonism at the expense of balance, but the lack of oak helps to keep this nicely in equilibrium. One could even go as far as to call it refreshing, both as a wine and as a take on the Gigondas appellation.

Without a shadow of a doubt the finest, most complex and most ageworthy Southern Rhône red of the vintage in all the wines we tried outside of the 'big two' of Châteauneuf-du-Pape and Gigondas. Coming from a very special piece of land – blue clay (as found at Château Petrus) on a 8.5ha site complete surrounded by forest. The wine is harmonious, mineral and has a sense of unforced reticence that I associate with many of Burgundy's Grands Crus. This needs and deserves time – maybe eight or so years.

Mineral by name and mineral by nature! This fresh, delicate Bourboulenc-Grenache Blanc-Roussanne blend brings to mind a young Riesling, but in a somewhat more forgiving style. Like a good Riesling, this is a wine that I know from personal experience vastly improves with age, developing similar petrol-like aromas in fact. Give it four or five years and then team it up with fish for a Rhône white experience quite unlike most others.

Château Sixtine

The Diffontys are old timers in Châteauneuf-du-Pape it is fair to say, having been settled in the area since the 17th century. They were one of the first to bottle their wine at the estate back in 1902 and in 1992 the property's modern era began when Jean-Marc and his wife Karine took over the reigns. They gradually changed the Domaine's style to suit their tastes, in particular with the introduction to the range of the 'Réserve Sixtine', later renamed simply 'Château Sixtine' – a supercuvée that always offers masses of upfront fruit and body in a framework of exceptionally rounded tannins. Unsurprisingly, this style proved popular with Robert Parker too.

The 2019 vintage played to Château Sixtine's strengths, with both red and white showing even more of the 'wow factor' than usual. More than ever, the combination of quality, enjoyment and value here is in a league of its own.

For such a big estate with such a big reputation it is surprising to learn that everything is done here by one man – Paul Avril, although he did admit to getting in a helper at harvest time!

Avril eschews the concept of Supercuvées, with just a single red and white wine produced, so the very best grapes go into the Grands Vins. The results are spectacularly good, age-worthy Châteauneufs.

Avril's mother is from Burgundy, he studied there and he looks to emulate that region's finesse in his wines, something he succeeds in doing, despite the obvious fact that these are much bigger boned wines than anything found in the Côte d'Or.

Trying to produce a style he prefers, rather than chasing critical acclaim, he nonetheless gets it. Frankly, anyone with anything more than a fleeting acquaintance with Châteauneuf-du-Pape can taste that this estate produces some of the appellation's very finest wines.

Château de Beaucastel / Famille Perrin

"Purchasing a wine from this family is about as close to a guarantee of authenticity and high quality as one can expect." Robert Parker

The Château de Beaucastel estate forms a single 100 hectare+ block right where the Mistral wind funnels into the corner of the Châteauneuf-du-Pape appellation. Unusually, there are large plantings of the Mourvèdre grape, shunned by many in Châteauneuf in the past as being unsuitable for the appellation's climate, but increasingly coming into its own with global warming. All 13 permitted grape varieties are grown in fact, vinified separately and then blended to form three of the reference point wines of the Southern Rhône valley – the red and white Grands Vins, plus the separate Roussanne Vieilles Vignes bottling. Part of the estate, but falling on the 'wrong' side of the road that separates the Châteauneuf-du-Pape and Côtes-du-Rhône appellations is the vineyard where the fruit for the outstanding value Coudoulet is grown.



In recent decades the Perrin family have extended their holdings beyond the confines of the Château de Beaucastel estate itself, with wines from Gigondas a particular strength, although as Jeb Dunnuck notes; "in short, this is a brilliant portfolio across the board". 2019 was another strong vintage for this estate, with the wines able to retain classic structures and elegance to go alongside the vintage's natural ripeness.

Famille Perrin 'Les Cornuds' 2019 Vinsobres

Ripe, but savoury. This red-fruit driven Vinsobres is particularly gourmand with its fresh finish perfectly weighted to match up with food. Great value too.

An organic Domaine, based in Crozes-Hermitage and focussing on the production only of this appellation and neighbouring Hermitage itself, Yann Chave have been a mainstay of our Rhône range for several years now. Both of his Crozes-Hermitage cuvées use oak to good effect, but these are not overly heavy wines. That elegance that is necessary in the Northern Rhône is very much in evidence here, with trademark black pepper in abundance. In short, if you want to introduce a Rhône newcomer to the wines of Crozes-Hermitage, start with these well-made, textbook examples.

Chave's 2019s were magnificent when we tried them, capturing all of the vintage's potential. Josh Raynolds suggest this year's 'Le Rouvre' "might turn out to be the best version of this bottling I have ever experienced" and we would not digress from this opinion. That said, the Hermitage was, in contrast to last year, a real step up nonetheless. Such a brilliant wine that we are offering in magnums this year to best suit its aging ability.

Stéphane was very happy with the quality of his fruit in 2019 which showed a magic combination of high ripeness and acidity. This helped his wines show their trademark succulence, while retaining a wonderful freshness. The sole worry was the small quantities of fruit coming into the winery, meaning our share from this wonderful producer alas remains limited.

The 'Queen of Châteauneuf' (as referrerd to by James Molesworth) ruffled a few feathers when she arrived in the area in 2002 and started producing some brilliant wines at the historic but arguably underperforming Domaine Saint Préfert, which she converted to full biodynamics in 2013. 2016 is likely to be looked back upon as the year in which Isabel Ferrando's qualitative transformation of this Domaine was fully complete, the estate since then standing shoulder-to-shoulder with the appellation's greatest producers.

Isabel calls 2019 "a superb vintage", noting that "the perfect sanitary condition of the grapes has allowed the production of highly coloured, smooth and generous red Châteauneuf-du-Pape wines" after a hot, dry summer led to an early harvest.

Thankfully, yields are up on 2018, meaning that 2019 sees a very welcome inclusion in our range of the two tiny production wines that carry Isabel's name (rather than being labelled as Domaine Saint Préfert) – Colombis and F601. These single-vineyard bottling are two of the finest expressions of terroir in the appellation.

There is no doubt of the quality of the terroir in this corner of France and with such an obsessive perfectionist as Chapoutier in the driving seat, these wines express it to the full.

These are some of the finest expression of this Catalan terroir made, the top with the R.I., V.I.T and Chrysopée taking their place alongside the likes of Le Méal and L'Ermite as part of Chapoutier's élite 'Sélections Parcellaires' range. These are true terroir-expressive fine wines, sold at a fraction of the prices of their peers from more established regions.

He's a good chap, Michel Chapoutier. When family friends the Ferratons fell on hard times and started to sell-off parcels of land, in stepped Chapoutier with an injection of cash and just as importantly, winemaking talent. Ferraton Père et Fils has been kept as a separate entity rather than subsumed into the Chapoutier holdings, but what is arguably the best winemaking team in the Rhône applies its expertise to these wines just as they do to those featuring Chapoutier's own name.

The result today is a range of wines that like Chapoutier's performs right across the quality spectrum, but at prices that are scarcely believable given the outand-out quality being produced here. The perfect example of this is Ferraton's Hermitage 'Le Méal' versus Chapoutier's own 'Le Méal'. Ferraton's costs £325 per 6 IB versus £850 per 6 IB at Chapoutier, yet has the same high Decanter score (97) and a higher Jancis Robinson score. As Jeb Dunnuck puts it: "The only drawback to these wines is that, by and large, they're made in tiny quantities".

Visiting this Domaine one gets the clear impression of a man, Stéphane Ogier, with a laser-like focus on the quality of his wine. His cellar is a treasure trove of different parcels separately vinified, some to be blended later, and others to be released alone. 2019 white highlights include a standout Condrieu and a wine that does an eerily good impression of Condrieu, but at half the price. The reds feature the Temps Est Venu red – Stéphane's only wine from the Southern Rhône, as well as the 'Syrah de Rosine', made from grapes grown just outside the Côte-Rôtie appellation boundary.

There are three key things to know about the wines of Domaine Rostaing. The first is that only a very small proportion of new oak is used, allowing the purity of the fruit to shine through. Secondly, high proportions of whole bunch fermentation are used, giving structure to the wines and making them 'vins de garde' rather than ones to drink immediately upon release. Finally and most importantly, they are truly excellent, with René's son Pierre crafting to perfection the fruit of some of Côte-Rôtie's most enviable vineyard holdings. Rostaing's Côte-Rôties are not the cheapest on the market, but when the quality is compared with others both within the appellation and more widely in France, the prices are more than justifiable.
